## WRITTEN ASSIGNMENT

All participants are required to submit, at the latest <u>4 weeks after</u> the end of the Summer School, a final paper (max 8 pages) in English on the topic of **National law approximation procedure and accomplishments**, which will respect with the following outline:

- Introduction
  - In brief presentation of the state of the play of EU integration process of the country from which participant of the Summer School came
- · Procedures for adoption of new laws
  - In brief presentation of the national procedures for adoption of new laws, starting from the drafting to the adoption in the Parliament
- Procedures for adoption of new sub laws
  - In brief explanation of the internal government's procedures for adoption of new Sub Law
- Harmonization of national legislation with EU acquis
  - o In brief mentioning the (non)existence of NPAA, achieved results etc.
- Procedures for checking the quality of harmonisation process
  - o In brief explanation of the tools for quality checking: Statement of Compatibility and Table of Concordance (when these tools were introduced, how many until now, overall experience etc...)
- Conclusion
  - o Review of the capacities for the harmonization of national legislation with EU acquis
  - Needs for some changes in procedures or process (if any) based on the lessons learned on the Summer School
- Annexes:
  - o Example of the Statement of Compatibility for one new Law
  - Example of the Table of Concordance of one new Law

The submitted papers will be reviewed and returned to the individual participants with comments by EIPA's faculty staff. Please note that a copy of the submitted papers and EIPA's comments will be submitted to ReSPA. The successful submission of final paper is a precondition for the payment of the remaining second instalment of per diems and for the issuining of the certificate of attendance.
