BACKGROUND AND OBJECTIVES

In September 2023, representatives of data protection authorities and competent Ministries from the Western Balkans and Eastern Partnership countries met with different EU institutions and bodies (the European Commission, European Parliament, European Data Protection Board (EDPB) and European Data Protection Supervisor (EDPS)) as well as national data protection authorities as part of a "Data-protection high level learning week". This week was organised with the support, among others, of the SIGMA Programme and the Deutsche Gesellschaft für Internationale Zusammenarbeit GmbH (GIZ) Programme "EaP Regional Fund for Public Administration Reforms", Regional Cooperation Council (RCC) and Regional School for Public Administration (ReSPA).

Building on this successful encounter and to further strengthen the partnership between the data protection authorities of the two regions and their EU counterparts, the EDPB, the EDPS, also for this upcoming edition the SIGMA Programme, GIZ, ReSPA, RCC agreed to team-up and in collaboration with the European Commission (Directorate General Justice and Consumers, DG JUST) jointly develop a Western Balkans and Eastern Partnership Region's Data Protection Academy as part of the week.

The Data Protection Academy is a project created by the European Commission (DG JUST) that offers support and training for data protection authorities of non-EU countries. It provides a platform for data protection authorities outside the EU to exchange views, best practices, and lessons learned with their EU counterparts. As such, it helps to build capacity, establish contacts, and facilitate effective international cooperation between data protection authorities, which often find themselves dealing with or investigating similar issues. These trainings also contribute to global convergence in the area





















of data protection and strengthen partnerships in the area of justice with key foreign partners of the EU.

General aims of the data protection week are:

- Support capacity building for the DPAs, including part of the training to be on good practice on the organisation (optimal capacity, profiles of employees etc.) and management of an independent authority;
- Provide for exchange of experiences and knowledge with EU data protection authorities, including on oversight of the public sector, and technical matters related to the most critical issues of GDPR implementation and investigation and enforcement of compliance issues;
- Meeting with key players EUROJUST, EUROPOL, CoE, EDPB, EDPS and national DPA's;
- Provide best practices and share experiences on training of data protection officers;
- Share knowledge and experience on the data protection implications of increased digitalisation of services, unified approach and data protection of the services.
