Background

The Regional Academy on the evidence-informed policymaking process is ReSPA's initiative aimed at enhancing the efficiency and effectiveness of policymaking in Western Balkan public administrations. The Academy prioritizes strengthening cooperation with national governmental authorities and academic communities, increasing the involvement of national host institutions, and offering extended, comprehensive learning programs. It also emphasizes providing opportunities for highly participatory engagement from attendees representing national institutions.

The primary goal of the Academy is to further enhance the capacity of civil servants in evidence-informed policymaking and to deepen their knowledge of methods and tools that increase the efficiency of complex policy planning. Additionally, harmonizing policy planning approaches across the Western Balkan region will facilitate a better understanding of common problems, more precise solution definitions, and rigorous preparation of ReSPA Members for full EU integration. The Academy aims to improve participants' knowledge and professional skills related to the evidence-informed policymaking process and provides opportunities for networking with colleagues from the region.

ReSPA organized the first module "Introduction to Policymaking" from October 18-21, 2022, in Novi Sad, Serbia. This module bridged theory and practice, covering key elements and stages of the policy cycle, from agenda setting and formulation to decision-making, implementation, monitoring, evaluation, and policy learning. The second module, held from June 5-8, 2023 in Bar, Montenegro, focused on monitoring and evaluating public policies. Both modules were conducted in collaboration with national academic and governmental institutions. The first module introduced the policy cycle and policymaking process, while the second concentrated on policy monitoring and evaluation.

The third module, "Policy and Budget," took place from April 2-5, 2024, in Mostar, Bosnia and Herzegovina. It aimed to deepen participants' understanding of the connections between policy and budget planning, highlight the significance of financial planning for policy implementation, and provide practical tools for costing and budgeting policy documents. This module also featured case studies from Bosnia and Herzegovina and explored various budgeting approaches, including gender budgeting.

The forth module "Policy Making in a Digital World" was organised in Ohrid, North Macedonia from 24 – 26 September 2024. The focus was on leveraging digital tools and platforms to enhance data-driven policymaking, citizen engagement, and effective policy implementation and monitoring. It also provided practical examples of the usage of digital tools in public policy development and coordination in North Macedonia, the Western Balkans, and EU Member States.

Following the successful realization of the first four modules, ReSPA is organizing the fifth one, focusing on the Regulatory Impact Assessment (RIA), a cornerstone for transparent, efficient, and EU-aligned policymaking. The fifth module of the Regional Academy on evidence-informed policymaking will be held in Tirana, Albania, from 4-6 November 2025. The concrete objectives of the fifth module, "Regulatory Impact Assessment for Effective Policymaking," are:

- Introduce the RIA framework in the Western Balkans and EU Member States and its role in evidence-based policymaking and EU integration.
- Provide hands-on experience in developing RIA.
- Foster peer learning and create a network of RIA practitioners across the region.

This module of the Academy will again bring together representatives of governmental institutions, mid to senior-level professionals with experience in policymaking, actively participating in policy planning, government coordination institutions, and line ministries.
