Participants will delve into the toolbox for enhanced cooperation and exchange of experiences. Initiatives like ComPAct and the TAIEX Programme take centre stage, alongside testimonials from ReSPA regional Mobility Programme and the initiative "Young Cells Albania."

The World Caffee session will serve as a forum for probing discussions on the burning issues that the public services are facing. From attracting the next generation into the civil service to innovating recruitment practices and embracing the concept of Green Administration, each round table offers ideas, visions, and solutions.
